An Act to repeal the Dera Ghazi Khan Development Authority Act, 1991

It is necessary to repeal the Dera Ghazi Khan Development Authority Act, 1991 (VI of 1991) so that Dera Ghazi Khan Development Authority may be constituted under the provisions of the Development of Cities Act 1976 comparable with the Authorities constituted in many other cities of the Punjab *inter alia* for orderly and planned growth of the city of Dera Ghazi Khan.

Be it enacted by the Provincial Assembly of the Punjab as follows:

1. Short title and commencement.— This Act may be cited as the Dera Ghazi Khan Development Authority (Repeal) Act 2017.

(2) It shall come into force at once.

2. Repeal of the Dera Ghazi Khan Development Authority Act, 1991.— The Dera Ghazi Khan Development Authority Act, 1991 (VI of 1991) is hereby repealed.

3. Savings.— Notwithstanding repeal of the Dera Ghazi Khan Development Authority Act, 1991 (VI of 1991), any rules, regulations or appointments made, orders passed, notifications issued, contracts entered into, proceedings commenced, rights acquired, liabilities incurred, penalties, rates, fees or charges levied, things done or action taken under penalties, rates, fees or charges levied, things done or action taken under any provisions of the repealed Act shall continue to have effect unless repealed, recalled, withdrawn or cancelled.

4. Repeal.— The Dera Ghazi Khan Development Authority (Repeal) Ordinance 2017 (X of 2017) is hereby repealed.
